

I would like to review Kimberly Einmo's book <u>Jelly Roll Quilts & More</u>. This book was reviewed five years ago. We have added many new members to the guild, so I think it is worth revisiting. Jelly rolls are fun and easy. Your colors are coordinated. Strips are cut. All you have to do is select your pattern and sew! Ms. Einmo gives many really good hints throughout the book. Her best one might be to use Spray Sizing (not starch) when ironing fabric that has just been washed. She says the sizing makes the fabric behave and removes all the wrinkles.

This book is really good for both beginning quilters and seasoned ones. There are many pretty quilt patterns in the book with very precise directions. She explains common rulers that you are likely to use, e.g. Flying Geese ruler. I made the Jacob's Ladder quilt that is in the book. I found the directions easy to understand and precise. Let us know if you make one of the quilts in the book.

SIZES FOR CHARITY PROJECTS

Patriotic quilts: Wheelchair and Lap quilts

Bereavement wraps 12" x 12" or 15" x 15" (use pattern)

<u>Mother's hearts</u> (ask for pattern) used for preemies in neonatal depts.

<u>Preemie Beanies</u> (knitted) ask for pattern or Google them

<u>Quilts for Christian Adoption Agency</u> - any size but include a sample square from the quilt pattern which is given to the birth mother.

<u>Isolette covers for Vidant Hospital</u> should be no larger than 36" x 36"

Quilts for Nash Hospital Nursery: They accept any size quilts that they send home with the babies. We will accept smaller blankets that are knitted or crocheted. We can always find someone who has a need. Also preemie hearts, bereavement wraps.


<u>Oncology Department quilts:</u> can always use lap size quilts and mug rugs for them.

<u>Comfort Bags:</u> 12" x 15" with Velcro closure; no handles. Ask for pattern.
