Charity and Outreach

Tis the season for giving! There were 4 quilts and a collection of mug rugs donated at our November meeting for a total of 42 charity hours. Many thanks to Deb Shearin, Lin Varney, Sandy Batchelor and Joyce Barrow for their generous donations. The focus for December donations will be the Christian Adoption Agency. We ask that when you make a quilt to donate, also make an extra "comfort square" from the same fabrics as the quilt. The quilt will go with the baby to his/her new home, the comfort square is for the birth mother to keep. In January we will focus on quilts for the NICU at Nash General Hospital, any size is fine. In February we will collect quilts for NICU at Vidant. These quilts should be no larger than 36" x 36. At both of these sites, our quilts go home with babies who have been in the NICU. There are other smaller items that can be donated as well. See Jinx (at the Membership table) for patterns for Bereavement Wraps and Mother's Hearts. For our knitters and crochet artists, preemie hats are always needed. Mug rugs are used in the waiting rooms in Oncology Depts. at both hospitals. So many opportunities! Please remember that any item can be donated any month, following the schedule is optional. It's a busy time of year, but challenge yourself to make time to create something beautiful to warm the hearts of those in need.




