




Library Corner

You could have one of these in a miniature version. The library has the book Miniature Baltimore Album Quilts by Jenifer Buechel. There are 28 block designs that are commonly found in Baltimore Album quilts. Most of the quilts shown in the book used twenty-five blocks, but there was a beautiful sampler with only three. The author discusses all phases of the construction of the blocks, including needles, silk ribbon, and stitches used. You could try one block and see if this might become your new passion. I hope someone in the guild will try this.

Lap size quilts, does not have to have patriotic theme. Attach TRPQG label


April — Christian Adoption Agency

The team can be a group of friends or a Bee. To sign up for a month, please see a Leadership Team Member at the Guild meeting.


Members who volunteer for the event will be entered into a special drawing to be held in May.
